

Fairfax County's Citizen Reporting System (CRS) is designed to make it easier for you to report a crime. Not all crimes may be reported via CRS but the following are examples of those that are: Trespassing, Noise Violations, Destruction of Property. The Virginia State Police maintain a searchable database for registered sex offenders and crimes against minors. http://sex-offender.vsp.virginia.gov/sor/
According to the Web site, the Virginia State Police has not considered or assessed the specific risk of re-offense with regard to any individual prior to his or her inclusion within this registry, and has made no determination that any individual included in the registry is currently dangerous. The main purpose of providing data on the internet is to make the information more easily available and accessible, not to warn citizens about any specific individual. Information is current and the site is easy to navigate.

Let It Snow, Let It Snow... But Don't Forget to Keep Your Sidewalks Safe

According to the Farmer's Almanac, the 2009-2010 winter looks like it's going to be a snowy one. We've already had a beautiful first snow this year. Although snow turns the outside into a winter wonderland for kids of all ages it can turn our sidewalks into pure agony. Please remember to clear snow and ice off your sidewalks as soon as possible, especially the walks that also serve as bus stops for our kids. We want our kids to have fun this winter, not hurt themselves while trying to get to school.

Trash Services Go Green(er)

Recycling is beneficial to our environment, our well-being, and it is necessary for sustaining our planet's resources for generations to come. Our Long Branch community has long been recycling to help our

environment. But, it wasn't always easy—sorting your recyclables into their various containers. Now that process has been replaced with Single Stream Recycling. Both American and AAA disposal services offer Single Stream Recycling.

What is Single Stream Recycling?

Single Stream Recycling is an innovative process that allows the consumer the freedom of putting all of their recyclables into the same container, a process called commingling, without the bothersome tasks of bundling and sorting. At the state-of-the-art single stream recycling facility, the recyclable materials are introduced into the sorting process via a single conveyor belt. The materials are screened and sorted by various electromechanical means: magnets for ferrous metals, eddy currents for non-ferrous metals, air jets for plastic containers, heavy duty rotating screens for corrugated cardboard, etc. The resultant separated materials are ready for baling & shipping to factories to be remanufactured into new & useful products.

Broken Water and Sewer Lines

It seems there has been an increase in failure and replacement of sewer and water lines to our homes. We would like to take a quick poll of how many homes have had their lines fail and needed replacement. Fairfax County Public Schools FY 2010 Proposed Budget Cuts

It seems to be on every school-aged parent's mind—the FY 2010 budget cuts. Fairfax County Public Schools is looking at a \$316 million shortfall for FY2011. Here is a partial list of what is being considered for reduction or elimination next year. For the complete list please visit:

- Athletic Fees would be assessed: \$100 per sport per student
- Two sports (one men's, one women's) would be eliminated
- AP and IB test fees would be assessed
- Class size would increase by 1 student, resulting in teacher layoffs
- Assistant Principals would have a 10% overall reduction
- Elementary Band & Strings program would be eliminated
- Full Day K would be eliminated at all but 34 (Title 1) elementary schools
- Foreign Language Immersion programs would lose funding for staffing
- Foreign Language in the Elementary School (FLES) programs would be eliminated
- Modified Calendar schools would return to standard calendar

- Excel and FOCUS programs would be eliminated
- Summer School would be completely eliminated (except for ESY students)
- There would be fewer custodians
- Guidance Counselors, Psychologists and Social Workers would be reduced and/or have
- heavier caseloads
- School Based Technology Specialists would be reduced by 50%
- One Alternative High School will be closed (Pimmit Hills)

As parents we can get involved with our schools and join the dialogue surrounding this very important issue.

This system allows VDOT to track issues more effectively and to maintain a more complete database of issues for funding purposes.
