"A Little Less Talk, And a Lot More Action!" by Chino Kearney

If you like or know anything about country music you probably recognize the name Toby Keith. Toby made a song a few years back called "A Little Less Talk and a Lot More Action". There's a line in the song that goes, "Let's get on down to the main attraction with a little less talk and a lot more action". It seems that attitude applies to more than Toby Keith and country music; it actually applies to sports ... and evangelism. Let me explain.

There are a lot... and I mean a LOT!... of football fans in America. Actually, there are probably a lot of football fans right here in this room. I'm not one of them, but that's beside the point. One of most people's favorite sports to watch on TV is football. If you ever watch football, you know that the majority of the broadcast isn't actually about the action of the game at all. Rather, it consists of the teams huddling together, patting each other on the...head, and getting ready for the next play.

I read something recently that really got my attention. It said that some channels are taking the games that have been played, editing out the huddles...and the patting... and just showing the action. This gives the viewer the chance to just watch the actual plays. You can even watch a whole game in less than an hour. I'm gonna say those programmers know something about the viewing audience of a football game. The folks watching the game want to see the game, they want to see the players in action. A little less talk, and a lot more action!

Let me ask you something. Can you imagine what everybody would think if all the players huddled up, did their game planning, did their patting, then went back and sat on the bench? If they sat there for a while then came back out onto the field again, huddled up, did their game planning and patting, and went back again to sit on the bench. What the heck, right? Lots of planning, no plays, no execution, no action.

Well, believe it or not, that's what a lot of the watching world thinks when it comes to observing Christians. They watch us go to church on Sunday - or whatever day we go - where we huddle up and do our planning, only to go right back to our homes and jobs and do exactly what we were doing before we went to church. Next Sunday, we come back and do the same thing all over again. The world doesn't care so much about what we do on Sunday mornings. They don't care how many of us showed up at the last chapter meeting. They're not interested in how awesome we think the last CMA State Rally was. They want to see us in action! They want to see what we're like when we hit the field; when we're out "on the field" running the plays and delivering the Word.

Take a look at the disciples; they didn't really make a mark, perform numerous miracles, write the Gospels, and change the world until after Christ's crucifixion. It really wasn't until the Holy Spirit came and transformed them, pushed them out of the upper room and "onto the field" that the world got to see them in action and realize what they were really all about. They couldn't stay in the huddle with Jesus any longer, they had to "execute the plays" they had been taught for the past three years.

For the Christian, going to church, and attending meetings and rallies are all preparation for service and witness in a broken and hurting world. We can't just huddle up on Sunday, or any other time, and hope that alone will get the job done. When we come out of the "huddle" we have to execute the plays throughout the week. Let's break the Holy huddle, don't go back to the "bench", get out and get into action! We need to get out and get into the action by ministering and serving in a hurting world that we've been called to serve. Get out and let the world actually see what we've been huddling about.

A little less talk, and a lot more action!

The Name Above Every Name

In this Bible study we'll be attempting to accomplish two goals. First, we'll be looking at who God says He is and the embodiment of that in Jesus Christ. Secondly, we'll be looking at the differences in Bible translations. Bible translations are just that...translations. Because translations bridge the gap between our language and the original languages, you might notice differences between the various versions of Bible translations. Unless you can read Hebrew and Greek you are forced to read a translation of some type.

Some Bible translations attempt to make the wording as literal as possible and some try to make the intent of the scripture more clear. Regardless of which translation (version) you prefer, the message should be the same. Obviously, we're not endorsing one version over another; we encourage you to read and compare the scriptures for yourself and allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you.

In this study we will be utilizing the King James Version of the Bible as we attempt to understand who God says He is. For simplicity sake we have included the King James text. However, as we work through this study we'll also be asking you to read and compare the same scriptures in a different version (translation) of your choice. Ok, let's get started.

(Please take a moment and pray that God would make His Word clear to you.)

Let's look at who God says He is:

Exodus 6: 2-3: (KJV) *And God spake unto Moses, and said unto him, I am the LORD: (3) And I appeared unto Abraham, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, by the name of God Almighty, but by my name JEHOVAH was I not known to them.*

Psalms 83:18: (KJV) *That [men] may know that thou, whose name alone [is] JEHOVAH, [art] the most high over all the earth.*

Isaiah 26:4: (KJV) *Trust ye in the LORD for ever: for in the LORD JEHOVAH [is] everlasting strength: {everlasting...: Heb. the rock of ages}*

After reading these three scriptures,
Who does God say He is (what is the Name of God?) _____

(Please read the same scriptures in **another version** (translation) and compare the different wording.)

Now read:

Exodus 3:13 & 14: (KJV) *And Moses said unto God, Behold, when I come unto the children of Israel, and shall say unto them, The God of your fathers hath sent me unto you; and they shall say to me, What is his name? what shall I say unto them? And God said unto Moses, I AM THAT I AM: and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hath sent me unto you.*

- Who does God say He is? _____. (If you are studying this material with another person, take a moment and discuss the meaning and/or significance of God saying He is I AM.)

Read Exodus 3:13 & 14 in another version.

- Although the wording may be different do you get the same message? _____

- Can we say that the God says of Himself: I AM JEHOVAH? _____.

Now read:

Exodus 15:26 (KJV) *And (God) said, If thou wilt diligently hearken to the voice of the LORD thy God, and wilt do that which is right in his sight, and wilt give ear to his commandments, and keep all his statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am the LORD that healeth thee. (Some translations list the Hebrew; Jehovah-Rapha)*

Read Exodus 15:26 in **another translation** and fill in the blank below.

Genesis 22:13 & 14 (KJV) *And Abraham lifted up his eyes, and looked, and behold behind him a ram caught in a thicket by his horns: and Abraham went and took the ram, and offered him up for a burnt offering in the stead of his son. 
