To The Honorable Court of Ordinary of said County.
 The petition of Louise Adams wife of Asa A. Adams of said County respectfully shows that her said husband Asa Adams is the head of a family of a wife and two minor children and holds in his own right all the real and personal property set forth and described in the annexed schedule And your petitioner further sheweth that her said husband Asa A. Adams has and does hereby refuse to avail himself of the benefit given and granted to each head of a family under and by virtue of the provisions of section 1st. Article seven of the Constitution of Georgia, and the acts of the General Assembly providing for the setting apart Homestead of Reality and personality and for the valuation of said property. Wherefore your petitioner wife of the said Asa Adams now comes and files this her application for Homestead exemption as now allowed by law made and provided by statute of this State in such cases made and provided and by virtue of the constitution aforesaid and your petitioner prays the court to grant unto your petitioner a Homestead out of the property of her said husband estate to the value of two thousand dollars in realty and one thousand dollars in personality both to be valued at the time of setting apart. And that the same be set aside and exempt for and as a Homestead in the manner now prescribed by the constitution and laws aforesaid for the use and benefit of your petitioner the said Louise Adams age sixty five years who is the wife of Asa Adams and John Quincy Adams Palmer age twelve years Clarissa Louise Comell age eight years both minors bound to said Asa Adams husband to your petitioner. And your petitioner further further sheweth that she has given written notice to each of the creditors of her said husband. And this Homestead is hereby waived so far as the claim of John A. McMillan against the husband of your petitioner for the sum of Thirty six dollars principal besides interest Sixty six dollars.

The manner prescribed by law and your petitioner avers that the schedule marked Exhibit "A" contains the name of such and all of the creditors of her said husband upon whereon written notice of this application has been served as required by law. And your petitioner avers that the annexed schedule marked Exhibit "A" contains a correct description and value of all the personal property to which reference is hereby made. Your petitioner further prays that an order may issue to the County Surveyor requiring him to lay off and make a plat of a Homestead for said family and make a return thereof in accordance with the law out of lands of said Asa Adams.

Your petitioner therefore asks that the usual notice in such cases may issue and be published as is by law required and as in duty bound petitioner will ever pray.
