Were present on the 14 day of May, in  
the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and  
seventy three, at the residence of Wiley  
Adams. (married man) before and at  
the time of his death, about eight day  
before his death, in perfect possession of  
his mental faculties as appeared to us,  
and said Wiley Adams, called upon us  
the bystanders to remember and take  
notice of what he was about to say  
when he said that it had been his in-  
tention for sometime past to make a change  
in his last will and testament thereby  
to make a different disposition of  
some of his property but he neglected to  
carry his intentions into effect and that  
now it was not practical that he  
wished us to understand that he  
was desirous of changing the third  
article of said will and to supply an  
omission therein. First he desired that  
the first clause of the third article of  
said will in far as relates to the pre-  
sent growing crop of cotton be revoked

the bystanders' to remember and to be  
noted of what he was about to say  
when he said that it had been his in-  
tention for sometime past to make a change  
in his last will and testament thereby  
to make a different disposition of  
some of his property but he <sup>had</sup> decided to  
carry his intentions into effect and that  
now it was not practical that he  
wished us to understand that he  
was desirous of changing the third  
article of said will and to supply any  
omission therein. Just he desired that  
the first clause of the third article of  
said will so far as relates to the pres-  
ent growing crop of cotton be revoked  
and secondly he desired that said crop  
of cotton be given to Mrs. Margaret Mc  
daughter of said Wiley Adams, and  
Francis Adams, wife of said Wiley  
Adams. Thirdly that he desired that  
the said Margaret McLeod and Francis  
Adams assist in purchasing the  
land and iron fence provided  
the said stock of cattle are not suf-  
ficient for the purchase of the said

articles a few days which he died this  
May 21<sup>st</sup> 1873
