

## Human Sacrifice

Part I

There are two peoples on the earth, those to whom the Creator has spoken, and those to whom he has not spoken. Those who to He never spoke have hated and envied and slandered those He has chosen over them. The two peoples are like the two brothers, Hevel the second son offering the firstling of his flock, and Qayin the first who offered from the soil. Many know the story but do not understand it.

Hevel's offering was acknowledged, a sacrificial animal, but Qayin's offering was not acknowledged. Some hold that this is an acknowledgement of the requirement of blood for reconciliation. But this is not the meaning. But the offerings were just that and not required. Hevel's sacrifice of an innocent animal was not because of his personal sin, but because he learned from YHWH the Creator Himself. YHWH was the first sacrificer of animals to provide hides for the two people He made. This was not because it was the way things were meant to be. People could have lived happily with the other creatures YHWH created and in harmony without death and predation. But mankind chose wrongly. The animals were not involved but some suffered death to provide sustenance for His favored creation anyway.

Hevel's offering recalled this unfortunate state of death being brought to the world because of man's foolishness in choice. YHWH acknowledged it—'Yes, you are seed of those who brought death to the undeserving as well as yourselves. You would not accept what I provided, but instead are guilty of bringing a system of death, predation and exploitation of creation—you have perverted what was meant to be—and when you see the death of these poor creatures whose deaths you have chosen to depend upon, know that death is coming for you also—acknowledge responsibility for what you have chosen.'

Did YHWH hate Qayin? No, and He was concerned for Qayin and warned him of letting his pride being offended, and how it would allow more harm. But Qayin perceived the gravity of Hevel's offering but not the meaning. Was he familiar with the terror of a poor creature as death approached and smothered away the life that YHWH had bestowed? Was he aware that the atonement, the common understanding between creature and Creator, came with the acknowledgement of failing one's self and his Creator to the hurt of all, and that it should draw forth pain and dread and remorse? Qayin only perceived that death got YHWH's attention and was jealous of this perceived power. So if YHWH acknowledged this death of an animal, how much more would He acknowledge Qayin's killing of a man, his own brother whose relationship with YHWH Elohim Qayin resented.

Hevel's blood cried out to YHWH and witnessed against Qayin the man sacrificer. Still a mark was put upon Qayin to spare him and give him a chance of understanding, of remorse, and change. But the sons of Qayin the accursed have continued in the ways of their father using sacrifices of men in their desperate attempt to receive acknowledgement of the Creator, YHWH, because they will not understand. Even as they have come to the time in history in which will YHWH will restore all things, they continue to sacrifice men as an act of devotion to a human sacrifice they call Jesus. But the blood of "Jesus" (Yahshua) and the blood of Yahshua's people, whom YHWH chose, cries out from beneath the throne of YHWH witnessing against the nations not chosen by YHWH marked with the number of their apostle.

What I am describing are two of the most insidious events in the history of mankind, the origin of murder and the establishment of the religion of Paul of Tarsos—the beginning of fratricide and the justification of religious genocide; the establishment of human sacrifice and the glorification of human sacrifice; the beginning of wandering over the earth because of an act of hate, ignorance, and resentment and wandering over the earth to establish a religion based on hate, ignorance, resentment and lies; the start the mistake of Qayin, and its culmination in the Christian religion.

Have you never questioned the vulgarity of a religion that emphasizes sacrifice more than repentence, that is correcting the disobedience that began mankind's separation from YHWH, human sacrifice, and then leaps from the "necessity" of sacrificing animals to the requirement of sacrificing a man, a human sacrifice of "Jesus"! Or if you are of the orthodox Christian view, can you in your right mind see the biblical precedent for sacrificing "God" Himself in His "human incarnation" instead of a goat or bull??

YHWH has never accepted a human sacrifice nor does He want it. He even shows His displeasure with animal sacrifices. Why? Because He wants a human (or a god) instead?? 'Avraham was ready to sacrifice his son Yitzhaq. YHWH stopped him and provided a ram instead. He did not give another man to kill. Where does YHWH state that He wants, approves, or requires the sacrifice of a human being (or a god incarnated as a human) for salvation, favor, or anything? You will find only disgust for the practice.

Who required a human sacrifice in order to receive something from "God"? One needs only to look at the Mystery Religions, as Paul of Tarsos did, to save mankind such as Mithra, Serapis, Orpheos, and Paul's perverted portrayal of "Jesus." Was Yahshua a human sacrifice required by YHWH (of Himself??) whose blood is required to wash away sins—the sin of not believing Yahshua was the required sacrifice (according to Christians)? Yahshua was not even sacrificed. He was not brought to the Temple in the prescribed manner, have his throat slit with the hands of all the people he was to die for upon his head, he was not thrown upon the altar as an burnt offering, nor was his blood splattered upon the altar and those people, as a lamb would have been.

He was not eaten. That would be cannibalism—although the church taught that the wine and bread of communion physically transformed into the actual flesh and blood of "Jesus" at the tinkling of a bell for over a thousand years and saw to the execution of those who denied it.

Ebionites do not believe in human sacrifice. We also do not need belief in sacrifice of a human being or god to gain forgiveness of YHWH no more than we believe in other pagan religious practices. Nor do we believe in writings that pass off Mystery Religion and human sacrifice as inspired or even true. Ebionites do not believe in sacrifice as a replacement for repentance. Repentance is understood as commitment of change from rebellion to obedience to YHWH. We follow Yahshua, not Qayin the first murderer.

Whom have the Christians followed? Their religion is based on killing an innocent man as a sacrifice to YHWH just as Qayin sought the acknowledgement of YHWH by sacrificing his brother. Christians claim the sacrifice of a man (or god-man) to end all sacrifices. But they continue sacrificing men to "God" beginning with followers of Yahshua who would not accept the religion of Paul and his Mystery Religion sacrifice, and through the centuries murdering all heretics, enemies, each other, and Jews. Most recently this resulted in the holocaust of millions of Jews at the hands of a demon and people that were the products of centuries of Paul's teachings. How much blood will Christians finally require to wash away sin? Even the blood of "Jesus" does not seem to be enough as they proclaim it to be.

I saw under the altar the souls of them that were slain for the word of Elohim, and for the testimony which they held: And they cried with a loud voice, saying, How long, O Adonai, holy and true, dost thou not judge and avenge our blood on them that dwell on the earth?

The word and testimony of those souls and ours is the Commandments of YHWH and the witness of Yahshua. Those commandments do not require the blood of a man for salvation or atonement.

The Bible is about obedience and repentence. The good news of Yahshua was, "Repent! YHWH's Reign over the earth is coming!" How can you live under that Reign if you spend your life applying human blood rather than applying the commandments of that Reign to your life? "Jesus" is coming. Are U Ready?
