Missionaries of Charity Soup Kitchen








Goan Giggles



Craig Nazareth enlisted in the United States Army after graduating from high school in 1994 and completed Basic Training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina to complete his Army enlistment training in 1995. While an enlistee, he completed his application to the United States Military Academy (USMA) at West Point and was accepted.



From 1996 to 2000, Craig completed officer training at West Point and pinned on his fresh Lieutenant rank as he took the oath of office as an Officer in the United States Army. He proceeded to his 1st duty station in Arizona to begin his professional career. On a warm summer day in June at the new Eighth Army Headquarters in



Pyeongtaek, South Korea, Craig's supervisor and mentor, Colonel Greg Ford, his wife Isabel, and his children, participated in promoting him to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Craig completed 19 years of service and will proceed to his next duty station in August 2018. Craig greatly appreciates the support from the Goan Association. In fact, Craig recollects receiving a very endearing card in 2005 when he was deployed to Afghanistan, that kept his spirits up while away from family. Craig remarks, "The Association is more than just a social outlet, it is a venue where families and friends can find spiritual growth and make long-term relationships that last through thick and thin. Kheema—Parsi Style

<u>Lena Lobo</u>

Ingredients 0.5 kg ground beef 1Tbsp chili powder

Pinch of turmeric 1 inch piece ginger, crushed 3 onions chopped
1 heaped tsp coriander-cumin / (dhania-jeera) powder
6 cloves of garlic – crushed
3-4 tomatoes – peeled, seeded and chopped

Method

- · Sauté the onions in oil until golden brown
- ·Add the chili powder, coriander-cumin powder and turmeric powder
- ·Let it cook for 1-2 minutes
- ·Add the garlic and ginger and cook for 1-2 minutes until soft
- ·Add 1Tbsp of water and the tomatoes and cook until pulpy
- ·Add the mince and stir until brown
- · Add a cup of water slowly and continue to stir the mince
- · Cover and simmer until the water is absorbed
- ·Garnish with chopped cilantro and green chilies (optional)
- Serve with Indian bread (chapatti/roti/paratha)
