

Hi everyone,

I would like to thank everyone that rode @ Dave's funeral; I know he was riding with us in spirit. He love to ride. We will miss you Dave. It is time for riding, the days are starting to get warmer, still a lot of wind some days. In 2005 while in Casper's chapter D, I remember reading an article about road conditions and of course, construction, by Craig Steiner. So I'm going to share it.

"It's Everywhere, It's Everywhere!"

We have a saying in Wyoming; we have two seasons, winter and road construction. After traveling through much of the United States, I can tell you it's true for most states. As soon as you see any evidence of construction, it's smart to scrub off some speed, and also get your head into what's going on. Remember, traffic fines are double in work zones.

Read all signs to help prepare you for any road hazards that may be ahead. Also, leave plenty of room between you and the vehicle in front of you so you can see any approaching hazards. To predict surface hazards, the trick is to watch for changes in the road surface's color or texture, whether there's a sign or not.

The most common edge trap is uneven lanes, such as when one lane has been repaved and the other has not. At approach angles less than 45 degrees, the front wheel tends to get trapped by the edge, and the rider loses control of steering. It's tempting to think about easing up onto that smoother pavement, but you're better off to ride out the lane you are in. If you must cross the raised edge, swing away and swerve back to bounce over the edge at maximum angle.

Steel construction plates are used to cover deep holes. A shiny steel plate will be slippery. Don't overlook the fact that the edge of the heavy plate may form an edge trap. Stay away from any narrow grooves between plates. If you must cross, maintain speed and line to conserve traction.

Riding on loose gravel can be an unnerving experience. Counter-steering doesn't produce an immediate result, so we don't get the expected feedback that the bike really is responding. When riding in gravel, keep your feet on the pegs, loading your weight down low on the bike. Rather than trying to balance and steer with just the handlebars, shift your weight from one peg to the other. Use some throttle to help push the front wheel through the gravel. When riding a two-lane gravel road, stay away from the center to avoid the spray of stones from oncoming traffic.

Potholes are another big nuisance. They can wreck your wheels or yank the handlebars right out of your hands. Two tactics for avoiding potholes are to maintain following distance, and look where you want to go. Potholes will commonly appear in wheel tracks where tires pound the pavement, so you want to drive in another part of the lane.

Some road contaminations to look for are clay, road oil, tar snakes, and oil and antifreeze from slowing vehicles. On slippery surfaces, it's important to conserve traction, maintain a steady throttle, make only gradual changes of direction, and keep the bike wheels perpendicular to the surface.


Now that you have an idea of what to expect in a construction zone, you'll be prepared for it! Remember to be alert. It's everywhere - it's everywhere!
