Hi Guys & Gals. How many of you know and understand what "Hypothermia" is? As we all get the bug to break out our trusty bikes and hit the road, we should prepare ourselves for the ever changing weather conditions here in beautiful windy Wyoming. Hypothermia is a lower than normal body temperature. What does that really mean? Basically as your body loses heat, it starts to malfunction.

Do your hands work as well when they're cold and numb? Your brain suffers the same problem in the cold. as you get cold, you lose the ability to concentrate and react to changing conditions. This can be fatal on a motorcycle. How do we avoid hypothermia? 1) Know your limits, don't ride if it's too cold. If you are caught in the unexpected cold, pull off and get something hot to drink. Go inside where it's warm until your reactions are quick enough to save you life. 2) Dress appropriately. This could mean thick insulated gloves and electric clothing or simply wearing multiple layers of insulated clothing. Here are a few tidbits to ponder: 1) Always wear stuff that will make you look good if you die in the middle of it. 2) Drive carefully.
