Our program year runs from September to May, with the Annual Fall Banquet, timed to celebrate Chinese National Day, as the first of our get-togethers. This is also the time to renew your

Youxie and the China International Friendship Cities Association hosted the Chendu conference, titled "Happy City, Green Life".

At the December meeting, our 2 delegates will report on the trip, the conferences, travel, and events. They will include a slideshow with their presentation.
