Voyageurs to muster in Williamsport for 89th Prom, Dames to Rendezvous

oyageurs and delegates from the nine Voitures Locale of Grande du Maryland will convene July 31, 2010 at Potomac Post 202, Williamsport, MD, for the 89th Grande Promenade and 26th Grande Rendezvous. Grand Chef

de Gare Robert J. Ouellette, Sr. will preside at the opening rites of the plenary session at 9 a.m.

The annual Corporation meeting and election of officers and trustees will be chaired by President John P. Baron at 8 a.m.

The one-day Grande Promenade is a departure from the usual three-day schedule of activities, although many Grand principles and delegates will meet informally at the Red Roof Inn and Post 202 Friday afternoon for pre-Promenade activities.

Rooms are still available at the Red Roof Inn on Route 11, in Williamsport, a short distance from Post 202. You must make

The Grande Committee on Committees met prior to the Fourth Grande Cheminot in Woodsboro in April and chose the slate of officers for Administrative Year 2011.

AMONG THE NOMINEES: Patrick J. Hauke as Chef de Gare; Martin G. Price, Senior Chef de Train (East); John C. Cockrell, Chef de Train (North); Deborah DeFrank, Sous Chef de Train (North); Brenda Dougan, Chef de Train (West); and James Beckman, Sous Chef de Train (West). Chef de Gare Ouellette becomes Cheminot Nationale and is expected to be named to a National membership position.

Other nominees include: Norman M. Covert, Commissaire Intendant; Warren L. Dearstine and Francis M. Marino, Sous Commissaires Intendant.

Among the appointments, Earl E. (Gene) Benner will continue as Grand Correspondant, John P. Baron, Avocat, and

John W. Mackall Sr., Grand Aumonier. Sanford R. McGuire was appointed to replace the late Donald Donohoe as Nurses Training Directeur and will stay for 2011.

THE PROMENADE SCHEDULE includes registration from 8-9 a.m. with the Annual Corporation Business Meeting being conducted simultaneously, beginning at 8 a.m.

Chef de Gare Ouellette will bring down his gavel and ring the bell at 9 a.m. opening the 89th Grande Promenade.

The Joint 40/8 and La Femme Memorial Service will be conducted beginning at 11 a.m.

Installation of 2011 officers is scheduled following luncheon with the First Cheminot set for 2:30 p.m. The Promenade schedule does not include the traditional Saturday night banquet.

Warren Dearstine to relinquish CI post after nearly quarter century of service

Grande du Maryland will be missing a familiar face on its leadership team when the 2010 Grande Promenade concludes July 31, 2010.

Warren L. Dearstine of Mechanicsville will step back as Commissaire Intendant and Corporation Treasurer, jobs he has held for nearly a quarter century. He was elected at the 64th Grande

Promenade in 1985.

A long-time Voyageur in Southern Maryland Voiture Locale 456, Mr. Dearstine's ability to attend the quarterly Cheminots has been hampered by medical and physical challenges the past year. However, he has conducted financial affairs in an exemplary fashion, paying obligations promptly, managing accounts and providing written financial reports for each Cheminot and corporation meeting.

He has accepted the position of Sous Commissaire Intendant for 2011. He will con-

tinue as a corporate trustee (Class of 2012).

The financial team will also include Sous Commissaire Intendant Francis M. Marino.

The Grande Committee on Committees met in April to nominate the slate of officers for 2011 and extended its appreciation

for the long service of Chefs de Gare (Passé) Donald Fellows and Gale Murdock, who have been signatories on the Grande account for many years.

Mr. Dearstine will be advising Commissaire Intendant (nominee) Norman M. Covert. They began the transition in April, including establishing checking and savings accounts in a more accessible bank and beginning the transfer of funds. The transition will be completed in time to meet the deadline of July 31, 2010.

A World War II U. S. Army combat veteran of New Guinea in the South Pacific, Mr. Dearstine was discharged in 1945 having served since his induction in 1942.

He was wrecked into La Societe after having served as commander for two years (1961-1963) of John K. Fogarty Post 162, The American Legion. He also served the post as adjutant and treasurer. He also was elected county and district commander, serving one year as Department of Maryland Vice Commander.

His service to La Societe includes Chef de Gare and numerous leadership positions for VL 456, in which he remains as correspondant.

He was elected Grande du Maryland Chef de Gare for 1981 and served as Avocat Nationale and member of its Child Welfare Committee. He was also elected Sous Chef de Chemin de Fer.

Mr. Dearstine was retired in 1977 from the Public Works Directorate at Patuxent Naval Air Station after more than 30 years of federal service.

He and Dame Agnes will continue to serve La Societe and she laughingly agreed to continue being the "Sweet Sous" in the coming years.

Chef Price expressed great surprise when was named winner of the personalized Box Car Art picture.

The print has its origin when Chef Price talked with Artist Patrick McHenry of North Carolina about creating something that depicted the symbols of La Societe. A free lance artist, Mr. McHenry's work is valued among art afficiandos.

VL 155, Carroll Community College, establish Nurses Training grant

rederick/Carroll Voiture Locale 155 was able to follow through April 23, 2010 on its support to Clinical Nurses Training at Carroll Community College, Westminster.

Chef de Gare and Grand Senior Chef de Train Patrick J. Hauke and VL 155 Nurses Training Directeur Norman M. Covert signed an agreement with Carroll Community College Foundation, Inc. to fund one \$1,000.00 scholarship beginning this year.

CCC President Dr. Faye Pappalardo and Foundation Director Stephen Wantz offered the thanks of the college and students in its clinical program for the donation that is hoped will grow beyond the single scholarship through the foundation investment.

VL 155 signed a similar agreement with Frederick Community College Foundation, Inc. March 18, 2010.

The selection panel at both colleges will select the winner based on the same criteria.

Chef de Gare Hauke said the intent of Voyageurs of VL 155 is to reward student academic and personal excellence rather than financial need alone.

Recipients must be enrolled in the clinical portion of its nursing course of study.

Scholarships for students in clinical programs at the College of Southern Maryland, Ann Arundel Community College, and Chesapeake College's Easton and Cambridge campuses are supported by VL 456, VL 1230 and VL 1371, respectively.

John J. O'Connor, Grand Chef de Gare (Passe) was ordered to Voiture Everlasting Sunday, July 4, 2010. His passing on Independence Day is a bittersweet tribute to a Voyageur regarded as a true Patriot.

He was a member of Greenbelt American Legion Post 136, Voiture Locale 265 and Grande Voiture de Maryland plus other

organizations including Knights of Columbus 4th Degree, and Loyal Order of Moose.

A veteran of the U. S. Navy (1952-54) during the Korean War, John was hired by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). He was a member of the American Legion in Washington, D.C. where he was commander. He transferred to Post 136 and in 1984 was invited to join Voiture Locale 265 where he served numerous leadership roles, including Chef de Gare.

He was appointed Directeur of Public Relations and Pub-

licist for Grande du Maryland and was appointed to the National committee, on which he served several years. He also served on the Grande du Maryland leadership team when it hosted the 80th National Promenade in Hagerstown, MD in 2001.
