All of the tickets were sorted, all 15 winners were identified and contacted, and the winners were posted onto our club's web site (kiwanisblackhawk.com).

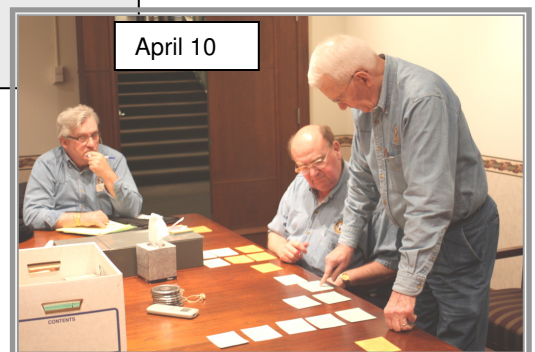
