<u>Project Eliminate</u>

Here is an update on the fundraising totals as of April 16, 2013. The Eliminate Project, Kiwanis's global campaign in partnership with UNICEF has raised \$29,068,467.

The averages for the top five Districts in the world are:
Japan, \$ 509 per member
Western Canada, \$ 487 per member
Australia, \$ 437 per member
Malaysia, \$ 300 per member
Southwest, \$ 195 per member

There are 53 districts in the world and Wisconsin-Upper Michigan (WI-UM) is 47th and lowest in the United States at \$ 35 *per member*.

Remember, Kiwanis is all about "Changing the World, One Child and One Community at a Time". Let's save a life; open our heart and our checkbooks. Remember it only costs \$1.80 to save a mother and a child.

Many of you remember the IDD project (lodine Deficiency Disorder) and we exceeded the goal that was set by Kiwanis International and UNICEF.

Announcements: Tree Sales - Next months agenda will include a discussion on whether or not to continue the tree sale project as a fundraiser or take a break from it.


