

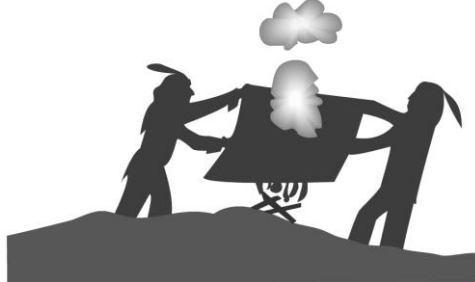

TREE SALE HISTORY

It all began with John Higgins coming up with the idea of having a tree sale selling Colorado Blue Spruce transplants.

By the second year, the orders filled were 6,500 trees. After several years under the co-chairmanship of Jack Biddick and Lyle Platner, Fred Adams, and Dick Fay, assumed the positions. Under their helm, the sales grew from 8,000 to 12,000 trees.

After running it for approximately eight years, Curly Bold and Reverend Roy Poltrock accepted the positions for the next two or three years. With the expertise of Maury Frey, we partnered with Rotary Gardens in 2012. At the present time, we are in our third year with them, and so the tree sale continues on.

Secretary's Report: Submitted as published in the April Smoke Signal and approved.

Treasurer's Report: Will Reck gave an update on the Truck on Ice totals and reported that after expenses, we netted \$10,385 and that the administrative and service accounts were in good shape financially. Will moved to file the report as submitted and it was seconded by Carl Cramer and passed.

Club Correspondence: We received a letter from Easter Seals thanking us for our efforts and contributions for Camp Wawbeek from the money raised in our Easter Lily fundraiser.

Old Business:

Financial Review Response - to the Financial Review Committee recommendations.

President Disrude thanked on behalf of the Blackhawk Golden K, members Dan Heerey and Ray Cummings for their review of our financial records for the administrative year ending Sept. 30, 2013. In response to the review team's recommendations, the Board of Director's must approve all fund raising and service activities that members participate in during the year. Approval of activities provides liability coverage to participants during the involvement of the approved activity. The board has not established policies that set procedures used to complete the approved activity. It was felt that the Board of Directors should develop policies that would protect participants from being accused of taking or mishandling funds and provides guidelines for committees to follow when involved in board approved activities that collect funds from the community. The committee chairs and member representation of committees impacted by this recommendation must be part of this process. Dave Peterson volunteered to head up a Policy and Procedures Committee along with Lily Day and Peanut Day committee chairs and Rocke Schroeder, to create policies that establish procedures with regards to the collection and handling of funds from fundraisers approved by the Board of Directors.

Truck on Ice Update: Pete Kealey reported to the Board of Directors that the Downtown Development Committee is not interested at this time in getting involved with the Truck on Ice ticket sales. They are still getting organized and are very involved with other projects at this time.

Traxler Park Sign Update : Glen Jablonka reported that the procedures for advertising on the new sign haven't been established as to what can be advertised and the costs involved so the suggested and approved amount of \$500.00 will be withheld until further clarification of costs and what can be advertised is known.
