

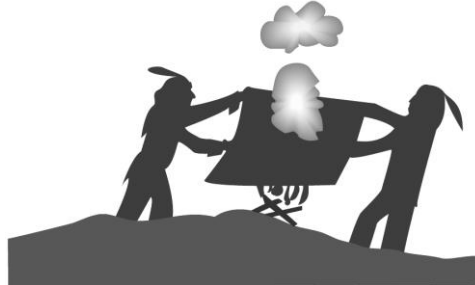

The Blood Drive was held at Faith Lutheran Church
on November 24th and 25th.

We collected 50 units on Monday and 80 units on
Tuesday with the goal of 70 each day! We gave out
134 apple pies to each person who either donated or
was deferred.

We had two members who donated blood (a single
pint has the potential of saving 12 lives). Fourteen of
our club members and one wife aided in being donor
room aides, refreshment aides, and greeters.

Eighteen of our club members delivered posters to
business within the Janesville area. I also contacted
Tami Carlson, HR person with the Janesville School
District, about sending a poster to each of the
schools. She said the poster meets their
requirements and they would be happy to send them
out to each of the schools.

We spent 72 service hours on this project. Thanks for
helping as it makes a difference in saving lives.

Secretary's Report:

Submitted as published in the November Smoke Signal and approved.

Treasurer's Report:

Will's report focused on the proposed budget for 2014/15 and included the updated figures for the tree sale. Will stated that the club is liquid and after some discussion, Will moved to file the report as submitted. The motion was seconded and approved.

Club Correspondence:

Ron received a thank you note from the Boys and Girls Club thanking us for our participation in this years Trunk or Treat activity.

Old Business:

Deceased Member Plaque:

Ron gave the board an update on the plaque and stated that it should be ready in about a week.

Will Reck's Intern:

It was decided by the board that an announcement should be made to the club to see if anyone would be interested in learning the skills and responsibilities of being a club treasurer.

Tree Sales:

The Board of Directors expressed gratitude that John Janes will chair this committee and that the Tree Sale will continue as one of our fundraisers.

Tree at Pontiac Convention Center:

Ron informed the board that the tree is done and showed the picture that Dave Peterson took of the tree. Ron did a fantastic job on this year's entry and encourages us to **vote** during the month of December (especially "**Best of Show**"). Last year Ron won the award and earned \$300 for the club.

Club Meetings:

No meetings are scheduled for Dec. 24 and 31 due to the holidays and the Board of Director's meeting will take place on Dec. 17 at 11:00 a.m.

Committee Updates:

Ron mentioned that the updated committee lists will be handed out on Dec. 3. A suggestion was made by the Board that the Membership Committee be responsible for maintaining the 3-ring binders.

Appeal Letter Report:

Maury Frey and Glenn Disrude presented a copy of the Year End Appeal letter and discussed the contents of the letter and the changes from last year. One of the changes will allow members to designate where they would like their donation to go to. After some discussion, Glen Jablonka made a motion to accept the Year End Appeal letter and it was seconded by Richard Johnson and approved.

Project Eliminate:

The topic of adding an incentive of \$250 from the club to the donations made by members so that we could have more Hixon, Zeller and Centennial awards was discussed. This incentive money would come from funds allocated for Project Eliminate. The Board of Directors decided not to change our awards policy.

Other Items:

A motion was made by Richard Johnson to approve acceptance of new member Jerry Burhans into our club and was seconded by Glenn Disrude. The motion was approved.

Glen Jablonka gave an update on the sign at Traxler Park. He reported that the sign is paid for and it will be free to advertise approved messages such as Truck On Ice for at least one year. After that the possibility of charging individuals or groups may occur.
