

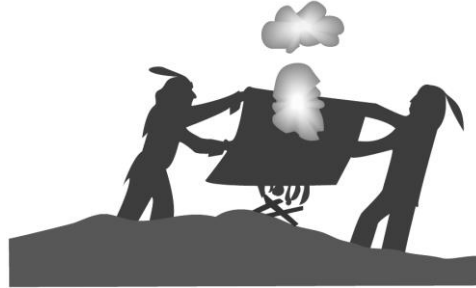

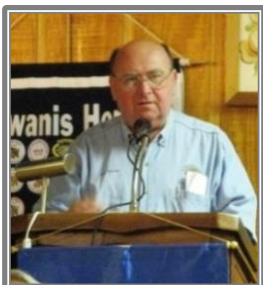

Treasurer's Report:

Meeting Adjourned at 8:58 a.m.

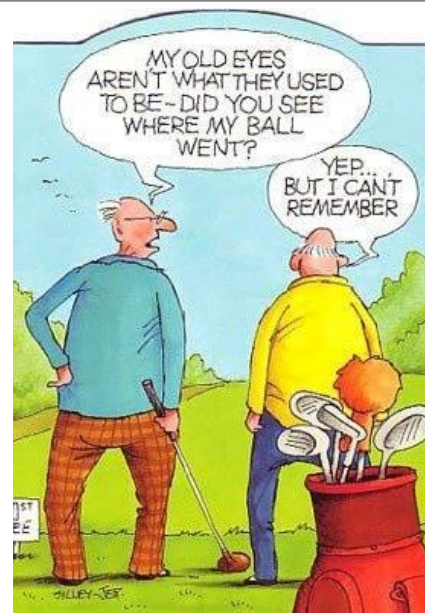
