

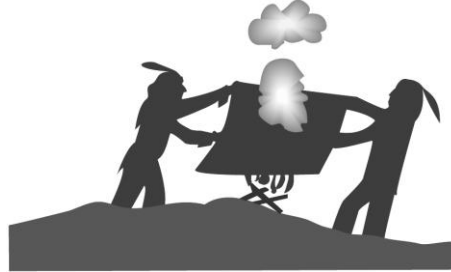

Call to Order: 8:31 a.m. by President Johnson

Secretary's Report:

The minutes were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

Treasurer's Report:

Will stated that on the December balance sheet under scholarships, the amount of \$4,500 reflected the fact that three scholarships were never given out due to those students not attending college. The unspent amount of \$1,500 will be kept in the service account. Will also reported that the amount of \$892 filed as Misc. under disbursements reflects the amount spent on the purchase of our new projector. Will made a motion to file the report as submitted and was seconded by Carl Cramer and approved.

Old Business:

Financial Review:

President Johnson brought up the topic of forming a committee to draft a response to the year-end financial review submitted by Dan Heerey and Ray Cummings. A committee was formed made up of Dave Peterson, David Thill, Richard Johnson and Carl Cramer to draft a response to be submitted to the board at the January 25th board meeting with recommendations for discussion and approval. The Board will then submit this response to the Financial Review Committee. This committee will meet at 8:30 a.m. on Wednesday, January 11th to draft a response.

End of the Year Campaign:

Maury Frey gave a summary of the end of year campaign and stated that this year's campaign was very successful and it raised over \$4,000 which is about a thousand dollars more than last year.

Background Checks for Volunteers:

Carl Cramer submitted a recommendation that the club should pay the \$25.00 per person to Kiwanis International for a total of \$75.00 to cover the volunteers fees associated with the required background checks that Kiwanis now requires. This fee covers a two-year period. The background checks are for the Lincoln K-Kids program and the Edison Builders Club. Rocke Schroeder seconded the motion and it passed with Maury Frey and Will Reck voting against.

New Business:

Christmas/Valentines Parties:

Carl Cramer made a suggestion to the club for consideration about future Kiwanis parties. He brought up the idea of having a luncheon instead of a dinner so that members who don't like to drive at night would be able to attend and perhaps get more people to attend these events. The Board recommended bringing this topic up for a vote at one of our regular membership meetings to determine if this would be a better solution.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:00 a.m.

A Note from our Chairperson, Luci Cramer

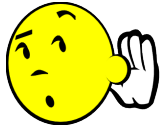

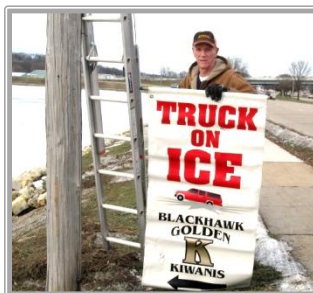
