Call to Order: 8:30 a.m. by President Cramer

Secretary's Report:

Paul gave an update on the club bylaws. Kiwanis International replied that they have received them and will inform our club within the next five weeks if they have been approved or denied. The minutes were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

Treasurer's Report:

Will stated that the Administrative Account has close to \$17,000, the Service Account about \$7,700, and \$1,000 unclaimed in scholarship money that will be put back into the account. A suggestion was made to look into funding some new projects and transferring some funds from the Administrative to the Service Account to do this. Further discussion with ideas will be presented at future Board meetings. Will moved that the report be filed as submitted and was seconded by John Sarnow and approved.

Old Business:

Information on Foundation for Club Donations:

Carl Cramer reported that the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin is not a good fit for our club due to expenses, legal paperwork and distribution of funds for charitable causes. Carl said he would look into the District (WI/UP) Kiwanis Foundation for club donations and the Noon Kiwanis Club. Dave Thill suggested looking into a 501(C)3 as a possibility for a club foundation. He will be providing more information on that idea at a future meeting.

Annual Meeting of Club:

The club must nominate and elect two new members to the Board of Directors, (*replacing John Sarnow and Linda Servais*) and nominate a new Vice President. The nominees are Don Anderson and Wayne Olson for Directors and Tom Neumann for Vice President.

New Club Brochure and Power Point Video:

Luci Cramer and Dave Peterson presented to the Board the updated Club Brochure to be given to all club members for the benefit of recruitment of new members and the new Power Point Video that will be seen at Blood Drives for member recruitment as well.

New Business:

Support of Governor's Project and District Project:

Carl Cramer informed the Board that this years Governor's Project is the playground at Camp Waubeek for children with disabilities. The project needs \$60,000 to fund what they want to accomplish with the playground. The (WI/UP MI) District Project is a five-year program on Autism and getting kids I-Pads to help them engage and learn in a way that only I-pads can accomplish. A suggestion was made that our club could help contribute to these projects with some of the surplus money that we have in our accounts. The Board will consider these matters at a future Board meeting.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:05 a.m.

Members of the Edison Builders Club will be participating in two activities in May.

On May 30th, members will serve as guides for current 5th graders who will be attending Edison as incoming 6th graders this fall.

On May 19^{th} & 20^{th} they will participate in the Renaissance Faire at Traxler Park. They will be doing crafts and playing games in a designated children's area.
