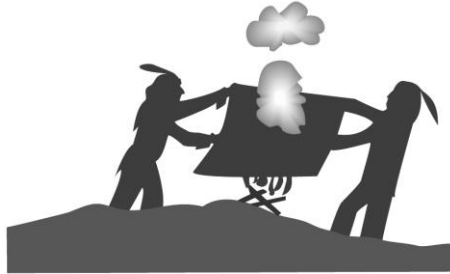

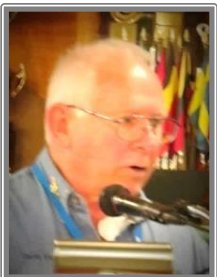

Secretary's Report:

Minutes approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

Treasurer's Report:

Will reported that all accounts are liquid and moved to file the report as submitted. Report seconded by Bob Douglas and approved.

Old Business:

Truck on Ice Final Report:

Revenue from T.O.I. totaled \$12,262. Prizes and expenses totaled \$5,169 for a net gain of \$7,093.

Review of Organizations Receiving Contributions from Blackhawk Golden K:

Discussions on how we determine, why we donate and how much to donate to clubs, organizations and individuals took place. After much debate, it was decided that the Budget Committee will meet again to look into how to get the most benefit from the money we donate and report back to the Board next month. Since the club took in about \$3,000 less this year from T.O.I. it was determined to allocate funds to projects where more kids will benefit from our donations. With that in mind, Luci Cramer made a motion to not allocate extra funds for the Hope Institute of Uganda but still allow Ron Shuler to continue to use the money he gets from the Christmas tree competition to be donated to the Hope Institute. The motion was seconded by Tom Neumann and passed.

Jim Clark Bench at Pickle Ball Court and Costs:

The cost of the bench will be about \$425 and that also includes the concrete and installation and an additional expense of \$150-\$170 for the plaque. The Board has already approved \$600 to be allocated for this project. The Board decided to offer members a chance to contribute to this bench with the understanding that any funds raised would help offset a portion of the previously approved amount.

Progress on the Call Team Regarding Cancellations/Announcements to Club Members:

David Thill stated that he and Richard Johnson are still working on it and will report back at a later date.

Progress on Updates to Business Cards & Pamphlets (Membership Committee):

The new sample card created by Dave Peterson was distributed at the Board Meeting and was met with great approval by the Board. It was decided to have them printed in whatever quantity is necessary.

New Business:

Weekly Meeting Expenses:

Maury Frey gave an update on our weekly and monthly expenses. He reported that there was an error in billing from Rotary Gardens and they will reimburse the club for any incorrect bills. In the past, our bills were determined by membership attendance but now we have a fixed rate to pay. Sometimes there is a deficit based on money collected at the weekly meetings. The club may have to look into the

possibility of raising the weekly dues for coffee and donuts. We have not had a rate increase in years.

Sound System Repairs & Expenses:

David Thill informed the Board that all expenses for repairs to the sound system will be taken care of by Rotary Gardens.

Lily Day Fund Raiser:

Linda Servais reported on the great success of the Lily Day Project, which raised \$2,249 for Camp Wawbeek. Thanks Linda!
