#### Secretary's Report:

Minutes approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

#### Treasurer's Report:

Will Reck reported that the Budget Review Committee met again and recommended not to pay \$2,500 each to the University of Rock Co. and Blackhawk Tech. The \$5,000 will stay in the Service Account until instructed for allocation elsewhere. Will stated that all accounts are very liquid and moved to have the report filed as submitted. Bob Douglas seconded the motion and was passed.

#### Old Business:

## **Scholarships & Donations to Local Organizations:**

Discussion centered on revising and updating our allocation amounts and what we should donate funds to. It was determined that the Budget Review Committee should meet again and present to the Board at our June meeting a list of recommendations along with dollar amounts for the Board to vote on. In keeping with our charter and the club bylaws, the Board feels that our donations should be more focused on children rather than adults and where we can do the most good with our money.

Carl Cramer made a motion to eliminate the Univ. of Rock Co. and Blackhawk Tech scholarships based on the current recommendation from the Budget Committee. The motion was seconded by Bob Douglas and passed. It was also recommended to inform these institutions of our intent and our reasons for this change in policy. Will Reck stated that he would inform them by letter.

#### Jim Clark Pickleball Bench:

Our club has not received a bill yet for the cost of the Jim Clark Memorial Bench but two members of our club have offered to split the cost. Bob Douglas and Wiley Kessinger have graciously offered to pay for the bench and we have been informed that it should amount to \$425.

## Renaissance Faire Report:

The final dollar amount hasn't been determined, but Dave Thill and John Janes will inform the club as soon as they know how much the club will receive.

## **Progress on a Call Team:**

Dave Thill said that he's still working with Richard Johnson on a call team when cancellations occur or other membership announcements are necessary.

## **Donations to Rotary Gardens:**



The Golden Kiwanis Club will conduct the annual flag retirement ceremony on Wednesday, June 12<sup>th</sup> at Kiwanis Park after our regular meeting.

After 13 years of exposure to the Wisconsin elements, considerable rusting, leaking and peeling had occurred, necessitating removal and repair of the drop



box. A metal fabrication company in Milton, All-Fab, Schiefelbein, Inc., Guy President, sandblasted the entire surface, weld-sealed primed leaks and the surface for \$300. This paid amount was anonymously by generous fellow Kiwanian.

Parker High School art students, under the direction of instructor Sam

Van Galder, redesigned and beautifully repainted the flag drop box so that is now in mint condition.

The Janesville Park Department will pour a new cement slab and reinstall the box in Kiwanis Park soon so that we can continue to receive old, tattered or torn American flags for proper patriotic retirement.

Once again, Court Street Kwik Trip and Gray's Brewing Company will provide refreshments. The Janesville Parks Department, Boy Scout Troop 539 and the Janesville Gazette will all be represented to again make the American Flag Retirement Ceremony, initiated in 2008 by Dave Soderberg, a successful event.
