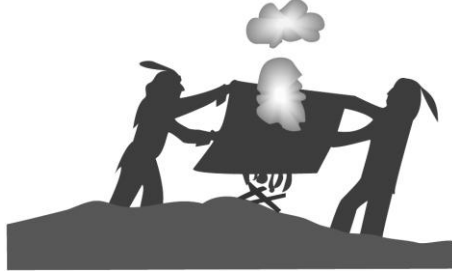

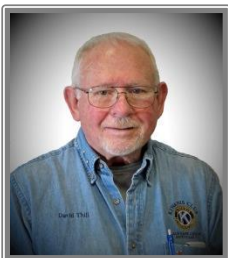

Peanut Days & Buckley Picnic:

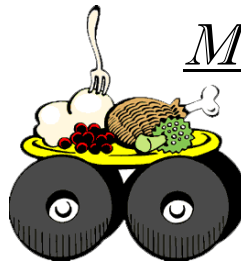
