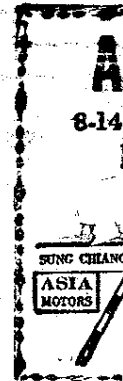

CAF Jets, Red MIGs Engage In Brief Air Battle Over Straits

A brief air battle took place over the Taiwan Straits at 4:42 p.m. yesterday when eight CAF Sabers encountered 16 Soviet-built MIGs while flying on a patrol mission, it was reported by the MND. No losses, however, were sustained by either side.

Meanwhile, the Red batteries on the Peiling Peninsula opposite Matsu fired a total of 35 shells at Kaoteng Island of the Matsu complex. Some of the shells contained propaganda leaflets, the MND added.

8,000 Rounds Against Operations Continued

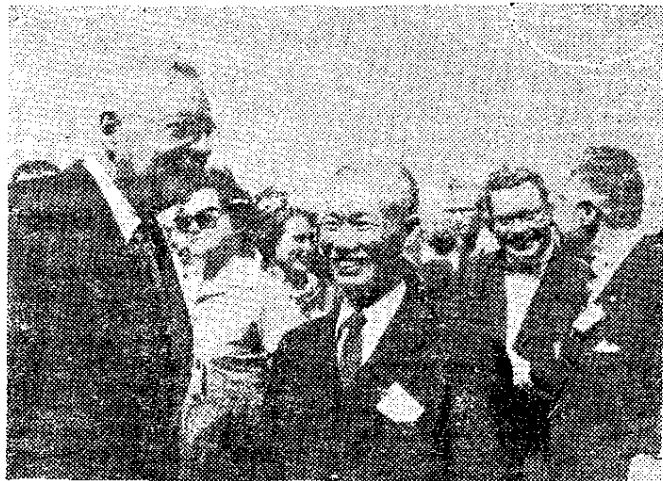
eries opposite Kinmen fired a total of 8,000 rounds against the offshore island complex from the mainland yesterday, according to a Defense Department spokesman.

Over 8,000 rounds were fired in the afternoon, while only sporadic shelling occurred in the morning, the communiqué said.

Supply operations for Kinmen will be continued as usual in spite of the resumption of Communist artillery bombardment, Military Spokesman Rear Admiral Liu Hoh-tu declared yesterday.

Whether American war vessels will escort the Chinese supply vessels to Kinmen will be decided, a military spokesman said.
