What is the Ruby Award?

Soroptimist Ruby Award: For Women Helping Women

The Soroptimist Ruby Award: For Women Helping Women program acknowledges women who, through their personal or professional activities, are working to improve the lives of other women and girls. Examples include: spearheading an effort to open a domestic violence shelter, starting a mentoring program for at-risk girls, or lobbing companies to provide on-site childcare. The program begins on the club level, where the type of recognition varies. Award winners at the club level are eligible for additional awards at other levels of the organization. The finalist receives a \$5,000 donation to the charitable organization of her choice.

Eligibility Requirements

Women who are improving the lives of other women or girls through their professional or personal activities are eligible for the Soroptimist Ruby Award: For Women Helping Women. These women have identified and focused on a need in their communities, which has significantly contributed to the improvement of women and girls' lives. Although Soroptimist clubs are free to honor a woman for a lifetime of good work, the majority of the work should have occurred within the past two years.

Past recipients include: U.S. Congresswoman Patsy Mink; U.S. Congresswoman Patricia Schroeder; novelist and former district attorney Linda Fairstein; Princess Diana; former child actor and U.S. Ambassador Shirley Temple Black; Philippines President Corazon Aquino; and renowned marine biologist Dr. Sylvia Earle.
