**October was Breast Cancer Awareness Month** in the United States. While this disease is difficult for any woman to face, it is especially difficult for low-income women who lack the necessary access to doctors and treatment. Soroptimist developed a white paper to shed light on this issue.

In 2007, breast cancer will be diagnosed in more than 1.1 million women. Responsible for more than 500,000 deaths each year, breast cancer is the most common cause of cancer-related death among women worldwide. Based on estimates of an average annual increase in incidence, the number of new cases projected to be diagnosed in 2010 is around 1.5 million.
